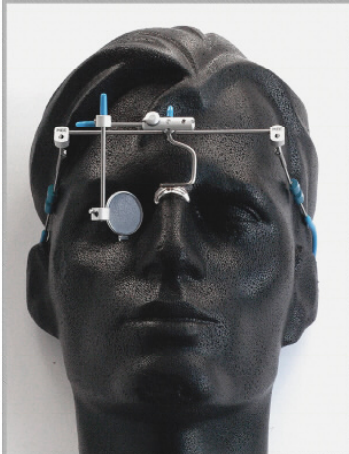

MECglas
system



The MEC-glas system is composed of carefully selected elements. You can exchange, adjust or add to them in a matter of seconds if time is pressing.

With the MEC-glas system, your options aren't just limited to the choice between headband and frame. For example, with the help of the Bayonet-fastening you can exchange lens-holders when you need to change positions or shoot with a different gun. Filters and blinders can be swapped. Left-handers simply change the basic elements over, because all parts are designed and manufactured on a fully mirror-image basis. For pistol-shooters, we supply larger lens holders and special adjustable iris units. Devotees of black powder shooting will find the obligatory compact-blinders in the system. In short, these are the shooting glasses with everything.

On the neighbouring pages you will find two Aiming Tests for Rifle- and Pistol shooters. It is worthwhile using this simple method to check your actual aiming ability at this moment in time. In the course of our wide-ranging testing, we have discovered faulty lenses and set-ups with astounding regularity.

The correcting lens is the key element of your shooting glass. The decision as to what you need, rests therefore in the hands of your eye specialist. Alongside short- or long-sightedness, you need to know whether a correction for astigmatism is necessary, as this condition limits the ability to recognise round shapes.

The exact choice of what corrective lens you need, should best be left with an optician/optometrist with special experience in the shooting sports. He/she will be able to determine from a practical trial (on the shooting range!), the lens which most helps you with your aiming. Once the prescription has been made, take care to ensure that your lens will be manufactured by a company which can grind lenses to fine tolerances! The adjustment of the frame to suit your shooting positions is also a job for an experienced person.
